North East Devolution

"Minded to" deal for the 7 North East local authorities to become a North East Mayoral Combined Authority (NEMCA)

Greater voice at a national level

Stronger investment proposition both nationally and internationally

Direct control over a 30 year, £1.4bn investment fund
