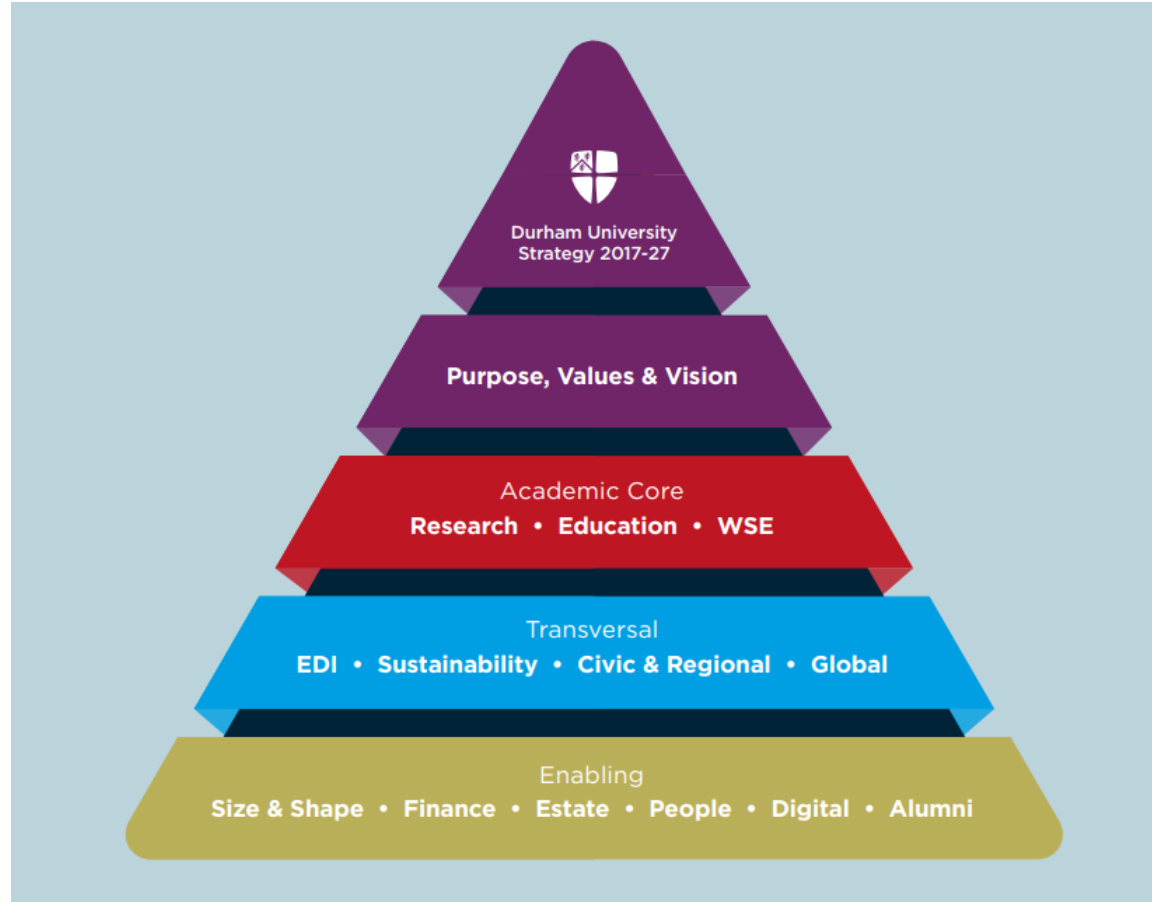
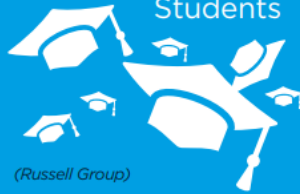

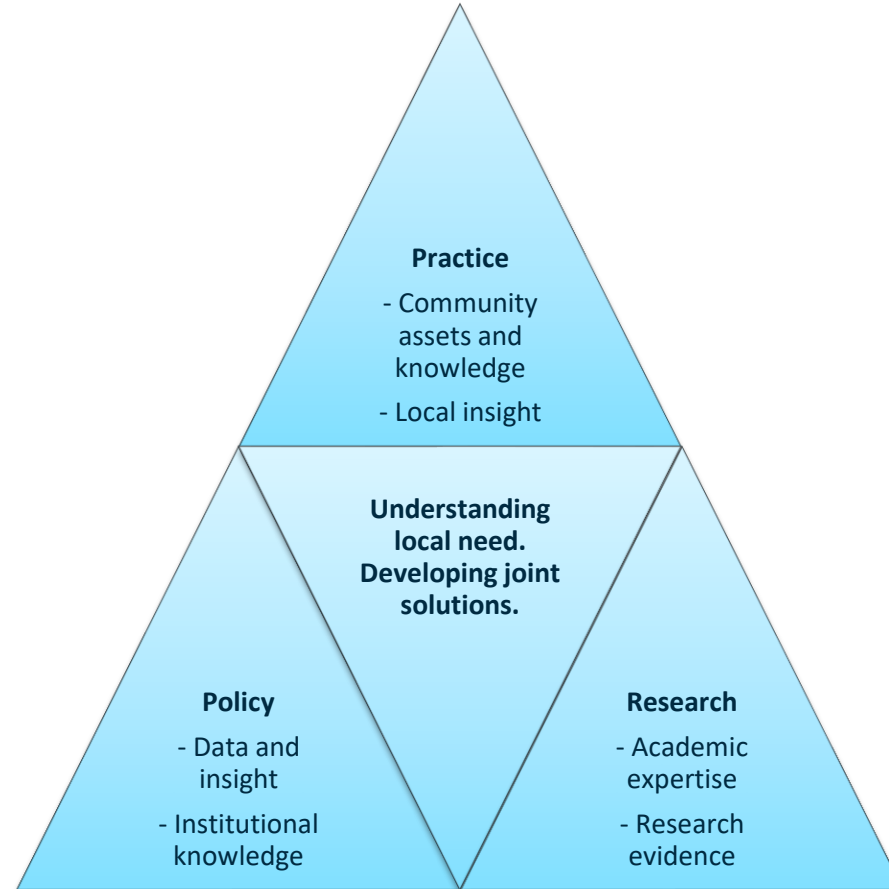

<p>Researchers spend time in 'policy' setting e.g. government department/parliament</p> <p>Respond to area of research interest/evidence need</p> <p>e.g. funded UKRI policy fellowships</p>	<p>Policymakers or practitioners spend time with University to develop research links</p> <p>e.g. Cambridge Centre for Science and Policy</p>

Durham Policy and Practice Fellowships

- Identified research opportunities/needs that respond to local need
- Ideas or interests identified through outreach and partnership work
- Topics or ideas put to research community
- Matched with research interest expertise
- Developed collaboratively to agree mutual benefit
- Opportunity for funded projects (or signposted to alternatives, e.g. student placements or projects)
- Potential for incoming fellowships too
