
The Data Suggests

Data suggests we have a housing crisis with a shortage of affordable housing.

- High number of second homes
- High price of rents struggling renters
- Young people leaving the area.
- Older people unable to downsize.
- Low numbers of rural affordable homes

What are your communities' housing needs?

- If you don't have the answer, you may need one soon Government commitment to boost housing is moving ahead.
- NPPF guidelines require 53% increase in County Durham
- How many people in your Parish need affordable housing?
 Can remain hidden.
- Net loss nearly 3,000 affordable units in 10 years.
- The average number of bids on social houses in the county has increased from 4 bids per property in 2017 to
 44 bids per property in 2023-24 in Weardale it's 173.


Strong Indicators of Affordable Housing Need

- 9.5% social rented tenure
- 88.4% under occupied
- 11.4% of residents are under age 16
- 33.7% are over 65
- 72.5% cannot afford to buy at market prices

Medium Indicators of Affordable Housing Need

- Second homes account for 17.7% of housing stock
- 35% cannot afford to rent at market prices
- 65% homes are 3+ bedrooms

Mickleton currently has an affordable housing requirement of 3 new homes to be built per year.


