



Guide to Funding

Autumn 2021

As the coronavirus restrictions are lifting, many charities and community groups are beginning to reopen and reengage within their communities. They are considering how to adapt their services in response to new circumstances and the changing needs of their beneficiaries to ensure their long-term sustainability.

Introduction

In this guide we will provide a short introduction to funders supporting not-for-profit organisations in County Durham, helping you to choose which funds best meet your needs and the needs of those you are supporting.

This guide is not an exhaustive list, there are other funds available, and new funds regularly released.

We will endeavour to keep the information in this guide as accurate as possible and respond to updates from funders as quickly as possible.

What can I do now?

Scenario planning and risk management assessment are useful activities that enable trustee boards to prepare for an unpredictable future. These processes support Trustees to consider what funding is needed to sustain the organisation. They will help you think about the funding needed to continue delivery of existing services or how to adapt the way you work in order to best meet the changing needs of your beneficiaries.

Financial planning is also important, and funders might ask to see your organisational budgets, when considering your application.

We have identified a list of funders below who regularly provide grants and other funding to voluntary and community organisations in County Durham. Please note these funds are constantly under review and we recommend checking the individual funders websites regularly for the latest information and updates.

[Arts Council England](#)

Arts Council England invest in art and culture for a lasting return. They are looking for organisations, artists, events, initiatives, and others to apply for their funding and help them achieve their strategy.

[Ballinger Charitable Trust](#)

Ballinger Charitable Trust give grants and other funding to charitable causes working with young and older people in the North East.

[BBC Children in Need](#)

BBC Children in Need's vision is that children and young people in the UK have a safe, happy and secure childhood and the chance to reach their potential. They award funding across several different programmes.

[Believe Housing](#)

Believe Housing have a Community Grants Scheme which supports projects that make a real difference to people's lives and wellbeing. Funding is open to applications from projects within the areas Believe Housing operates in County Durham.

[Coalfields Regeneration Trust](#)

The Coalfields Regeneration Trust have a variety of programmes and funding opportunities in England focused on improving their three key themes: health and wellbeing, employment, and skills. Their programmes and funding are delivered in their eligible coalfield areas.

[Comic Relief](#)

Comic Relief's vision is to create a just world free from poverty. They are doing this by funding and investing in amazing organisations across the UK and around the world. They fund a huge variety of organisations, each one working to tackle the key issues of our time.

[Community Buildings Support Fund](#)

With the support of Durham County Council Area Action Partnership Budget, Durham Community Action and East Durham Trust are working in partnership to provide support to those responsible for the management of community buildings, as COVID-19 restrictions are lifted, and activities fully return to communities. This project makes available a small grants scheme to help kick start recovery and build a stronger future by providing resources and capacity needed to ensure community buildings are safe and COVID secure.

[Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland](#)

Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland award grants to support a wide range of causes in Tyne & Wear and Northumberland, and across North East England. The grants come from nearly 300 different funds set up by generous people and organisations. You can apply as an organisation or as an individual.

[County Durham Community Foundation](#)

County Durham Community Foundation is a local grant-making foundation that awards grants from the many funds established by their donors to try to make a lasting difference in local communities. They do this by matching your application wherever they can to the most appropriate fund available at the time. They provide grants for groups, individuals and families in need.

[Durham County Council – Area Action Partnerships](#)

Each of the 14 Area Action Partnerships (AAPs) in County Durham have a budget for local projects and investments, in addition to Neighbourhood Budgets which each county councillor has to use for local initiatives, informed by the AAPs.

[Durham County Council – Community Led Local Development \(CLLD\)](#)

Community Led Local Development (CLLD) is a way of supporting local development projects using structural funds from Europe. It aims to increase employment and skills and social enterprise and ensures that local people are involved in developing projects, using resources in the area to address local challenges. There are two programmes for County Durham: North Durham and South Durham.

[Esmée Fairbairn Foundation](#)

Esmée Fairbairn Foundation is one of the UK's largest independent funders. Their three main aims are to improve Our Natural World, secure A Fairer Future and nurture Creative, Confident Communities.

[Foyle Foundation](#)

The Foyle Foundation is an independent grant making trust that distributes grants to UK charities. It supports charities in three main areas: Main Grants scheme supporting charities whose core work covers Arts and Learning, the Foyle School Library Scheme and a Small Grants scheme supporting charities in all fields with a turnover of less than £150,000 per annum.

Greggs Foundation is a grant-making charity which aims to build stronger, healthier communities in the areas where Greggs operates. Their intention is to provide grant funding where it can do most good by focusing on addressing issues of poverty and inequality, ensuring food is at the heart of communities and supporting local community organisations to make a real difference.

Hadrian Trust

Hadrian Trust aims to improve the lives of people living and working in the North East of England. Their main grant donations are in the fields of social welfare, youth, disability, the elderly, women, ethnic minorities education, arts, and the environment.

Henry Smith Charity

The Henry Smith Charity is an independent grant making trust who aim to use their resources to help people and communities at a time of need and to bring about positive change. They have a range of grant programmes available.

Karbon Homes – Community Funding

Karbon Homes have a Community Investment Fund and welcome applications from not-for-profit organisations and schools. The grants aim to support projects that make a real difference to people's lives and wellbeing within the communities in which they work.

Key Fund

Key Fund is a social investor dedicated to supporting new enterprises, creating new jobs and reinvigorating communities in the North of England and the Midlands.

Lloyds TSB Foundation

Lloyds TSB Foundation fund small and local charities, investing in their work helping people overcome complex social issues across England and Wales. Their funding focuses on racial equity and complex social issues.

National Lottery Community Fund

The National Lottery Community Fund awards money raised by National Lottery players to fund great ideas that help communities to thrive. They have a range of funding programmes and offer different amounts of funding – under £10,000 and over £10,000.

National Lottery Heritage Fund

The National Lottery Heritage Fund provide different levels of funding to heritage of all shapes and sizes. Their grants range from £3,000 up to millions of pounds.

Northstar Ventures

Northstar Ventures are a social investor and provide early-stage venture capital and impact investments to entrepreneurs with big ideas. They have a range of funds and programmes available.

[Sir James Knott Trust](#)

Sir James Knott Trust support charitable activity in Tyne & Wear, Northumberland, County Durham and Hartlepool by making grants to organisations. They operate on a rolling programme.

[Sport England](#)

Sport England invest National Lottery and public money to help people play sport and take part in physical activity. They have a range of funding programmes available.

[Virgin Money Foundation](#)

The Virgin Money Foundation designs grant making programmes aimed to support people to create positive change in their local community. They have a range of funding programmes – some are open to applications; others are by invitation only.

Funding Searches

Durham County Council manage a funding portal called [Durham4Community](#) for community groups which you can sign up to for free. It allows you to search for funding schemes available to your group, apply for funding and get advice on producing your funding application.

Durham Community Action Funding Top Tips

Before starting your application, please read through our 'top tips' to make sure that you have all of the information you need and that you have a plan before you contact them.

1. **Always check the funder's exclusions list**
2. **Make sure you meet the funder's priorities/criteria**
3. **Be clear and concise**
4. **Only provide information you have been asked for** Most funders will ask for your governing document and bank account details
5. **Be clear about why your project is needed and who will benefit from it**
6. **Know your outcomes and what difference your project will make**
7. **Provide an accurate budget**
8. **Complete application forms fully and accurately**
9. **Get someone else to read your application before you send it**
10. **Meet funders deadlines and timescales**
